This Hinoki Cypress is from Mark Arpaq, our designer, collection. The original tree is at the right. Mark noted that the tree had a lot of growth, but the trunk is interesting from many different angles. He trimmed off a lot of the foliage to get light and air into the inside of the tree. Plus it will now be easier to wire. He strongly suggests repotting in the spring at a new angle and it should ONLY be fertilized now. As it grows, pinch back the growth to make it fuller. Mark also mentioned snow watering. The snow will melt when its warm, watering the tree and then when it gets cold, it will freeze and stop watering. Perfect. If you water, you might put too much and the water will freeze and crack the pot.

The **Humes Japanese Stroll Garden** is a traditional Japanese garden complete with pond and Tea House. The weather was questionable and already broke two limbs still in a tree bordering a trail closed off for safety. Over 93 people (including ten children) enjoyed the garden and our bonsai exhibit. As president of LIBS I was happy to represent the society.

Inspite of portaging difficulties, I decided to show the Colorado Blue Spruce that Mauro Stemberger crafted for LIBS on Zoom during the Covid shutdown. We aired it live to the membership. The tree was fostered by myself for a year and always at the angle that Mauro suggested. As is customary all demonstration trees are raffled off to the membership. I ended up winning it back! Good Karma? ASAP I found an appropriate pot (not so light in weight) for repotting at the intended angle. This tree was at the first two LIBS Exhibits this 2024 year. I felt it should be at all of them, as it spoke to the "**Stewardship of Trees**" that our society promotes.

I rigged a harness with rope to allow two people to carry the big tree without rocking the roots. Except for two forests and a bonsai, all the rest of the trees and accessory plants were packed in 8 square buckets (from Tidy Cat Litter) with handles for safe transport. All necessary to navigate a rough wooden bridge and many steps.

Unfortunately, the second day of the exhibit was cancelled since the tree limbs came down on a major path in the garden. **However we did recruit four new members in the process.** Thank you to the staff of Humes (Mary!) and North Shore Land Alliance volunteers.




The middle and right pictures are the "Before and After". All the participants in the workshop enjoyed the learning experience.
